- The Fresno and Madera County DUI Task Force and thousands of law enforcement agencies around the country teamed up with NHTSA on a high-visibility winter enforcement campaign. The annual effort aims to reduce drunk driving year-round, not just on a few days during winter. The campaign is over, but the warning remains: *'Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over.'*
- The Clovis Police Department honored its 24-member Police Explorer Post in January at a banquet at the Clovis Rodeo Hall. During 2015, these young men and women donated more than 3,100 total hours of community service, in addition to training more than 2,000 hours (an average of more than 83 hours per Explorer). The post offered its support for almost 50 events and special details this past year. The Explorers' motto is "Lead The Way."
- Clovis Police advised people who have community mailboxes to keep an eye out for thieves and to pick-up their mail on a daily basis. In January, we experienced a spike in community mailbox breaches. Officers believe the breaches are taking place in the morning between 4:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. If you have any information regarding the possible identity of the person or people responsible for these crimes, please call Clovis Police Dispatch at 324-2800. If you see someone breaking in to a community mailbox, call 9-1-1 immediately. The Post Office is aware of the situation and is taking steps to repair damage to the community mailboxes.
- The Clovis Police Department was proud to host the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Community Breakfast on January 16th in the Clovis Veterans Memorial Building. This was the 29th annual breakfast honoring Dr. King in Fresno County and marked the 11th year Clovis PD presented it. "Live with Passion; Love with Compassion" was the theme of this year's breakfast.
